How to associate your existing ORCID iD

ASN encourages every author to register for and use an ORCID iD for:

- **Distinction:** Use of an ORCID iD will distinguish you from other researchers with the same or similar name by associating your work under a unique iD that you verify. Your ORCID iD remains the same whether you change your name or organization.
- **Attribution:** Your research outputs and activities will be correctly attributed to you.
- **Discoverability:** You will increase discoverability of your work by compiling your research outputs and activities into one publicly accessible location. The ORCID iD icon will appear next to your name in the article PDF. Readers can click on the icon to view your profile on ORCID.org and discover your other work.
- **Efficiency:** ORCID will maintain an ongoing record of your affiliations, grants, publications, and peer review activity, which can be valuable to potential collaborators, funders, institutions, and future employers.
- **Accessibility:** You can log into different ASN journal submission systems and other information systems using your ORCID iD (e.g., Crossref and Europe PubMed).

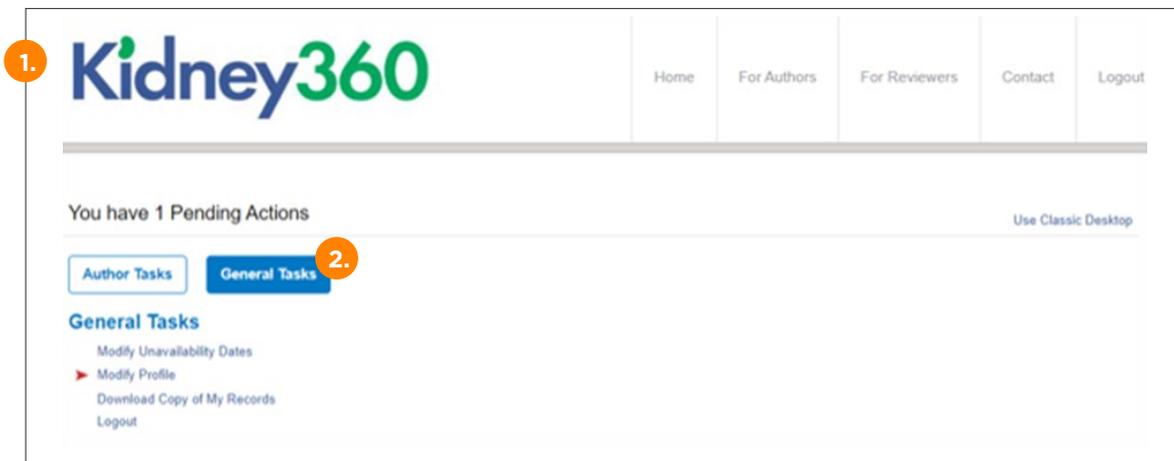

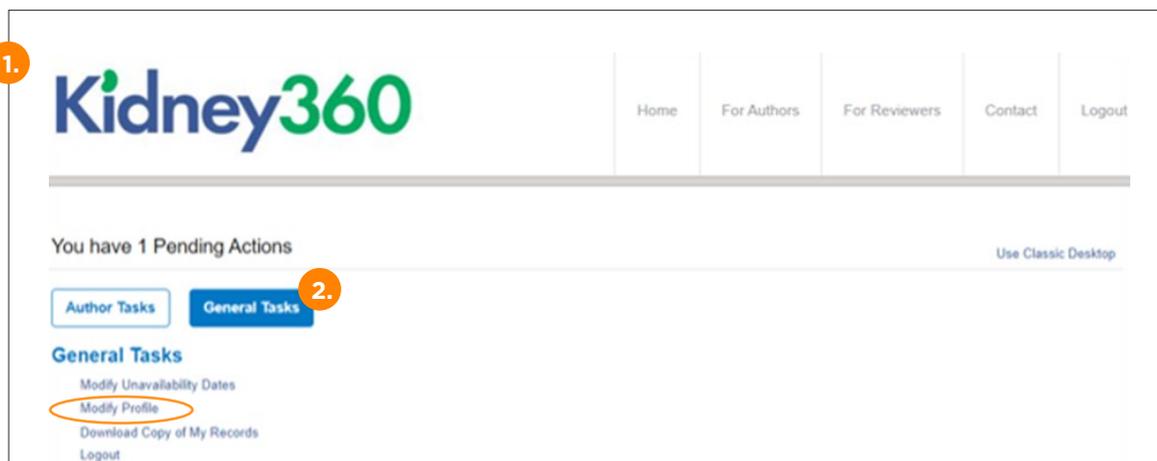
